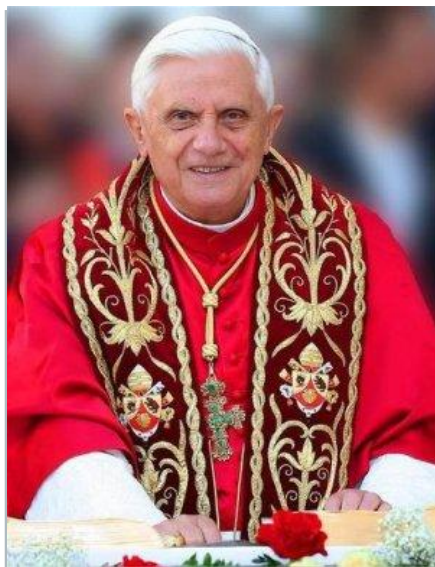

QUO VADIS DAYS



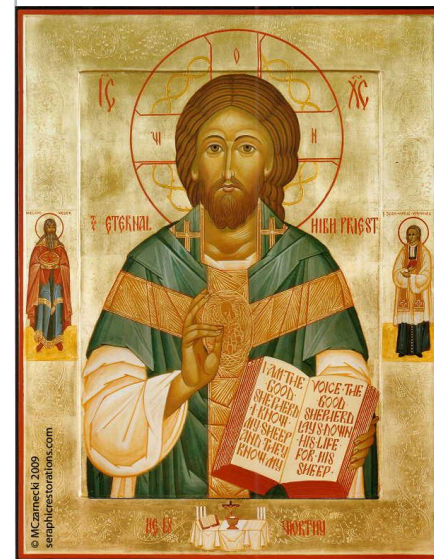
“The teaching and example of Saint John Mary Vianney can serve as a significant point of reference for us all” –*Pope Benedict*
